




To know the General Principles for moving people

Indirect holds • Larger contact area • Hold is from behind • Less tension on staff member's forearms, shoulders, chest and back

DAT198 - Talking the Donor from Floor to Sitting to Standing


DAT169 - Assisting a recovered Donor to Walk
