


Learning Outcomes

Indirect holds

- Larger contact area
- Hold is from behind
- Less tension on staff member's forearms, shoulders, chest and back







MPD106 - Safe System of Work and Risk Assessment


For People Handling these are guidelines only General Principles need to be applied

The NHSBT currently have 6 Safe Systems of Work

- DAT198 Talking the Donor from Floor to Sitting to Standing
- DAT169 Assisting a recovered Donor to Walk
- DAT197 Donor Faints from Standing
- DAT199 Donor Faints at the Refreshment Table
- DAT170 Emergency Evacuation of a Fainted Donor
- DAT2025 Moving Donor from Donation Chair to Floor for CPR
